



Interstate 10 Widening: Picacho Peak Road to Pinal Air Park Road



FACT SHEET

Project Overview

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) has designed roadway improvements to Interstate 10, from milepost 219 near Picacho Peak State Park, to milepost 232 at Pinal Air Park Road. The improvements include widening I-10 from two lanes to three lanes in each direction and reconstructing the Picacho Peak Road Traffic Interchange. Included in the traffic interchange reconstruction, Picacho Peak Road will be widened under the I-10 overpass by adding a continuous left-turn lane to the roadway. The goal of the project is to increase capacity and improve traffic operations and safety on this segment of I-10.

Project Schedule

- Design completed
- Construction began in the fall of 2007, and anticipated completion is winter of 2009.

Additional Projects

ADOT is planning to move forward with two additional widening projects along I-10 to expand the freeway to three lanes in each direction:

- State Route 87 to Picacho Peak Road: construction to begin in summer 2008
- Pinal Air Park Road to Tangerine Road: construction began in fall 2007, and anticipated completion is fall 2008
