

I-10 WIDENING

Prince Road to 29th Street

Interstate 10 Closure 2009

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) is scheduling a weekend closure of I-10 between Prince Road and 29th Street in order to remove temporary concrete barriers and reconfigure the flow of traffic. The closure is necessary for the safety of the traveling public as well as the workers involved. The contractor will be working 24 hours a day during this period to re-open the Interstate as soon as possible.

When I-10 Closes:

- I-10 is scheduled to be closed beginning at 9 p.m. on Friday, May 1, 2009, through 6 a.m. on Monday, May 4, 2009.
- Eastbound I-10 traffic will be detoured to the eastbound I-10 frontage road.
- Westbound I-10 traffic will be detoured to the westbound I-10 frontage road.
- Extensive signage will be in place to direct traffic.

When I-10 Re-opens:

- Eastbound I-10 traffic, north of St. Mary's Road, will be traveling on the west side of I-10 in the two lanes closest to the shoulder.
- Westbound I-10 traffic, north of St. Mary's Road, will be traveling on the east side of I-10 (on the newly constructed roadway and paved surface) in the two lanes closest to the median.
- All I-10 traffic, south of St. Mary's Road, will be traveling in the same configuration as prior to the closure.
- All travel lane widths will remain the same.

With the New Configuration, North of St. Mary's Road:

- Westbound I-10 traffic will be traveling on the final rubberized asphalt paved surface on the east side of I-10.
- Additional areas for emergency stops will be provided along I-10.
- There will be a greater separation between eastbound and westbound I-10 traffic.
- Rubberized asphalt paving will begin on the west side of I-10.

Westbound I-10 Entrance Ramps Tentatively Scheduled to be Opened (as work permits):

- The westbound I-10 entrance ramp at Miracle Mile is tentatively scheduled to be opened approximately two weeks following the I-10 closure (week of May 18).
- The westbound I-10 entrance ramp at Grant Road is tentatively scheduled to be opened approximately seven weeks following the I-10 closure (week of June 22).
- The westbound I-10 entrance ramp at Speedway Boulevard is scheduled to be opened approximately 12 weeks after the I-10 closure (week of July 27).
- Eastbound I-10 entrance ramps and east- and westbound I-10 exit ramps will remain closed until access to additional lanes on I-10 and traffic configuration on the frontage roads can meet standards to ensure safety in areas of merging traffic.

ADOT appreciates the community's patience and continued cooperation while work is done to improve I-10.
